Way to go, Brian!






Project Highlight

Emergency Department Readiness & Pediatric Care Coordination

For the past 18 months, Maine AAP has been working with the EMS-C on the Maine Always Ready for Children Program (MARC). Our Ambassador for this work is **Rosie Davis, MD**, a

hospitalist in central Maine. When we began outreach and engagement to make sure Maine Hospitals all had a Pediatric Emergency Care Coordinator identified, only 74% did. With encouragement and support, now over 90% have a PECC identified, and many have achieved recognition through the MARC program! A new website providing education, sample policies, educational videos, treatment algorithms and practice scenarios for a dozen emergency protocols including neonatal resuscitation, bronchiolitis, sepsis, asthma and more, is almost complete.
