Deborah Hagler, MD, MPH, FAAP has practiced pediatrics in Brunswick for the past 27 years. She attended Cornell Medical College and did her training at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. In 2021 she was awarded the degree of Master of Public Health from Bloomberg School of Public Health at Johns Hopkins where she focused her studies on child and adolescent mental health and substance use. Dr. Hagler has been an active member of her community, a past president and current Board member of Maine AAP and a board member of the Midcoast Youth Center (MYC). She has been assisting a dedicated team at MYC to implement *Strengthening Families Ages 10-14*, an evidence-based program that decreases family conflict and adolescent substance misuse.



He believed deeply in the power of scientific observation to improve children's health, so he set up clinics where students could learn from treating actual patients rather than just from lectures......
