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A Message from Maine AAP's President, Brian Youth, MD, FAAP

Happy early March! This month, I'd like to highlight a few of the important advocacy efforts taking place across the state.

Just yesterday, AAP President, Dr. Susan Kressly, wrote a letter sharing the Academy's advocacy efforts around Measles and Medicaid - <u>read it</u> here. We will work closely with the AAP to collaborate on opportunities to

use our voices, along with evidence based science, to guide our practice. A child dying of a vaccine-preventable disease is unconscionable.

Over the last month, we've written a <u>letter on behalf of our organization to Governor</u> <u>Mills</u> urging her to support Medicaid by opposing federal cuts; we've joined other organizations in condemning elected officials for harassing and sharing information about minors on social media; and many of our members have provided testimony in person, via zoom, or in writing on a variety of proposed bills including LDs 396, 537, 46, 480, and 582. Please <u>visit our website</u> to view the bills we have prioritized and to learn ways you can engage with lawmakers. Thank you to all who get involved in advocating for Maine children, families, and the health of our communities.

The <u>spring meeting agenda</u> is set and registration is open until March 14th. Each year, we look forward to this opportunity to learn together, celebrate our residents through the annual poster session, and have an opportunity to network with colleagues across Maine!

We will be joined by Maine CDC Director Puthiery Va, DO, who will share her vision for Maine CDC, public health priorities, and how the public health community can work together to solve complex challenges. Dr. Va shares, "Pediatricians significantly contribute

to public health by actively promoting preventative care, healthy lifestyles, and disease prevention in children, essentially acting as a key component of public health efforts focused on the pediatric population."

Gretchen Pianka was one of twelve pediatricians accepted from a national applicant pool to the 2024-25 AAP TIC Champion Program, a 10-month, bi-directional learning opportunity in implementing trauma-informed care. The program is a partnership with the CDC, the Univ of California, LA, and UMass Chan Medical School to increase the capacity and competency of pediatric clinicians to provide TIC to children and families

as part of the soon-to-be launched National Center for Relational Health and Trauma-Informed Care. Champions met at AAP headquarters in Itasca (photo below) for an inperson training with the previous cohort. Dr. Pianka will lecture in their upcoming AAP Trauma and Resilience ECHO series.
