<p>ANTICHOLINERGIC</p> <p>Anticholinergics: Atropine, Scopolamine, Glycopyrrolate, Benztropine, Trihexyphenidyl. Antihistamines: Chlorpheniramine, Cyproheptadine, Dimenhydrinate, Doxylamine, Diphenhydramine, Hydroxyzine, Meclizine, Promethazine.</p>								
<p>CHOLINERGIC</p> <p>Archoline, Carbachol, Carbamates, Choline, Metacholine, Mushrooms, Organic Phosphorous Compounds, Pilocarpine, Urecholine.</p>								
<p>OPIOID</p> <p>Carfentanil, Codeine, Diphenoxylate, DXM, Fentanyl, Heroin, Hydrocodone, Hydromorphone, Meperidine, Methadone, Morphine, Oxycodone, Propoxyphene, Pentazocine, Sufentanyl, Tramadol.</p>								
<p>SYMPATHOMIMETIC</p> <p>Adderal, Amphetamines (Dexedrine, Vyvanse), Caffeine, Cocaine, LSD, Mephedrone, Methamphetamines, MDMA, Methylphenidate (Ritalin), Theophylline.</p>								
<p>SEDATIVE-HYPNOTIC</p> <p>Anti-anxiety Agents, Atropine, Anti-Seizure Medications, Barbituates, Benzodiazepines (Diazepam, Diclazepam, Temazepam, Zanax), GHB, Muscle Relaxants, Ketamine, Lorazepam (Ativan), Preanesthetics, Rohypnol, Zopiclone.</p>
