FREE SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING FOR CLINICIANS

CAMS (The Collaborative Assessment and Management of Suicidality) is a trusted, evidence-based suicide prevention resource. Suicide prevention authorities such as the Surgeon General recognize CAMS as an effective suicide prevention program.

The <u>Foundational Video Course</u> features Dr. David A. Jobes, creator of CAMS, showcasing CAMS in action through 12 sessions, emphasizing collaborative assessment and treatment for suicidal patients. This course covers suicide drivers, lethal means reduction, CAMS Stabilization and Treatment Plans, setbacks, and alternative techniques.

Participants will receive <u>3 CE credits</u> for completing the Foundational Video Course, and the first 400 registrants will receive a hard copy of *Managing Suicidal Risk, A Collaborative Approach, 3rd Edition* by Dr. Jobes.
